

Release Letter



A **Letter of Release** (Release Letter) is a written authorization from a producer's current top level upline allowing them to move to a different upline or sales channel.

A release letter does not move you by itself. It allows a transfer request to proceed only if all eligibility, timing, and policy requirements are met.

Frequently Asked Questions:

When is a release letter required?	A release letter is required when you want to transfer to another upline or channel immediately, and you do not qualify for a Notice of Intent to Move (ITM).
Who must provide the release letter?	The release must be issued by your current top level upline.
What makes a release letter valid?	A valid release letter must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be on the upline's official letterhead • Identify the producer by name • Be signed by an authorized signer or principal • Be dated within the last 90 days
Can a release letter come from another agency in my upline?	No. Releases must come from the top level upline on record. Releases from lower levels are not accepted.
Where do I submit my release letter?	The release letter must be uploaded within your contracting evite or transfer request.
How long is a release letter valid?	Release letters are valid for 90 days from the signature date.
Does a release letter guarantee approval of my move?	No. A release letter allows the transfer request to proceed, but it does not override blackout periods, eligibility rules, or other policy requirements.
Do blackout periods apply if I already have a release letter?	Yes. Transfers cannot be completed during blackout periods, even with a valid release letter.
What happens if my release letter is missing or invalid?	If a valid release letter is not provided, the request may be denied or closed. A new request will be required once a valid release is obtained.
If I cannot obtain a release letter, what are my options?	You may submit an ITM (if eligible) and complete the required waiting period instead of providing a release letter.
Can UnitedHealthcare require my upline to provide me with a release letter?	No. UnitedHealthcare cannot require an upline to issue a release letter. Release decisions are governed by the contractual business relationship between the producer and their upline. Issuance of a release is solely at the discretion of the current upline.
Are release requirements the same for all sales channels?	No. Please refer to your Agent Guide on Jarvis for channel-specific release information.
